Rights and Responsibilities

RIGHT

• Something that a person can expect to be/have with no, or little government interference.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Things that we can do
- In order to enjoy OUR rights, we must respect the fact that OTHERS have rights too
- No one has complete freedom
- Often, there are consequences or punishments if we do not meet our responsibilities

Three Main Responsibilities of Being a Citizen (pg 5 text)

1. Informed Citizenship:

• We must understand how the government works, what the history of the government is and what its current policies are

2. Purposeful Citizenship:

• We must understand our role in the community as well as being sensitive to the values that guide our actions and decisions and the actions and decisions of others in society

3. Active Citizenship:

• We must use our knowledge to participate in our community, to influence our government, to DO things for and in our country

Three Levels of Rights

1. Rights as a Human Being: (Being a citizen of the world)

- United Nations (1948)
